Defibrillator for Thames Bridge Club

Why?

The vast majority of our members are high risk. Each minute from cardiac arrest to defibrillation decreases survival by approximately 10%.

Can we rely on Squash Club to maintain their defibrillator and provide access if needed? (If Pads used or damaged are they immediately replaced?)

Can we have training, "defibrillator monitor people" responsible? (Murphy's law)

What type?

As simple as possible, even though have people trained to much higher level.

Compatability: with St John, with Squash club

St John say they have many types of machines and our electrodes will usually be removed when they arrive.

Training?

Free from St John (or Elite, lifepak)if we buy their defibrillator/program We could do training if could borrow a manikin



Upfront cost?

St John Powerbeat X1 or X3: \$2863/\$3496

Elite / Lifepak CR2: \$3264

Ongoing cost?

Powerbeat: \$600 every 4 years; or sooner if used! \$315 battery, \$300 pads

Lifepak: \$550 battery, \$345 pads

Warranty?

Powerbeat 6 years

Lifepak 8 years
