Programme for 2026

Thank you to those of you who offered suggestions on the structure of our program for 2026. Special thanks to those of you who came along to a meeting on Saturday morning. It was good to see a wide range of players.

Among the items discussed, and which could be introduced in whole or in part, were

- 1. The introduction of new players to playing sessions. As many of this year's learners cannot come to daytime sessions we could adapt the Tuesday night sessions, by either having 2 separate sections running simultaneously, or by moving some (or all) of the Championship events to Mondays and/or Thursdays.
- 2. The reasons why players are reluctant to play on Tuesday evenings. While there are obvious reasons, (eg. driving to and from the Club at night especially in winter), the image that the Tuesday sessions are for senior players, and the dislike many have of coming along "just to get beaten" each time.
- 3. There is a strong preference to have more HiLo Teams events which allow "Hi" players to play with and compete against other "Hi" players, and "Lo" players to take part in the same competition while playing with, and against, other "Lo" players. As with all Teams events this works better if we have an <u>even</u> number of 4 player teams (ie 16, 24 or 32 players)
- 4. There is a preference for fewer "Individual" competitions.
- 5. There was discussion on prizes and trophies their relevance, the type of prizes, the recognition of prize winners.

The Committee will discus these matters at its next meeting (6 October). If you would like the Committee to consider your thoughts **please write us and email** as soon as possible. That will be the most effective way of ensuring your ideas are heard.

Mondays in October ===== Two sessions (of 12 boards) per day

First Session – a random draw

Second Session – top 2 from session 1 play each other. 3rd plays 4th, 5th plays 6th

Next sessions – 1st after previous rounds plays 2nd (if the haven't already played them – in which case 1st will play 3rd.

And so on until the final round, when each pair will be playing a pair at a similar level.
